Signs of a Natural Gas Leak

Why It Matters

Natural gas is safe and reliable when used properly. But leaks can happen, and recognizing the signs early can prevent danger.

Know the Signs of a Leak:



Smell

A distinct sulfur or rotten egg odor is added to natural gas as a warning.



Sound

Hissing, roaring, or whistling noises near appliances or gas lines.



Sight

Dead or discolored vegetation near pipelines, bubbling in water, or dust blowing from the ground.

What To Do If You Suspect a Leak:

1

Leave the area immediately.

2

Do not turn on lights, electronics, or anything that could spark.

3

Call 911 once you are outside and at a safe distance.

4

Contact your utility company.
